

## **Emergency Physician Advocacy Award**

Nomination Criteria

The Emergency Physician Advocacy Award for Ohio Chapter ACEP was created to recognize outstanding leadership in legislative advocacy efforts on behalf emergency medicine. The recipient of this award has advocated for their patients, their community, and their specialty and has engaged in advocacy efforts at local, regional, and/or national levels.

The 2017 *Emergency Physician Advocacy Award* will be presented at the **Ohio ACEP Emergency Medicine Forum**, to be held on May 3, 2017 at the Sheraton Columbus Hotel at Capitol Square.

The criteria for the Emergency Physician Advocacy Award for Ohio Chapter ACEP are as follows:

- 1. Current member of the Ohio Chapter ACEP
- 2. Outstanding emergency physician role model
- Generates support or raises awareness through legislative advocacy, health policy, and regulatory issues
- 4. Mobilizes grassroots advocacy efforts and/or or develops alliances that move the emergency medicine advocacy agenda forward

Please note that individuals who were nominated but not selected may be nominated in subsequent years and any member may be re-nominated any number of times.
