Dr. Welch has been a practicing emergency physician for twenty-six years and a quality improvement consultant for ten years. She is trained in emergency medicine at Emory University where she was chief resident and has served on the clinical faculty at Case Western Reserve University, Albany Medical College and the University of Utah, School of Medicine. She is board certified and a fellow of the American College of Emergency Physicians. She is also certified by the American College of Healthcare Executives in Healthcare Management.

She has served as a quality improvement consultant for Utah Emergency Physicians, Intermountain HealthCare, VHA, and Quality Matters Consulting Abaris Group. She has been an educator in the area of quality improvement for organizations like ACEP, SAEM. EDPMA, and AHRQ. She is a member of ACEP's QIPS section (Quality Improvement and Patient Safety) and a member of EDBA.
